Services for Homer G. Landis, 69, route 6, Decatur, who died accidentally Friday of burns suffered while he was burning brush on his farm, were conducted at 2 p.m. today at Zwick, Boltz & Jahn Funeral Home, Rev. Gale A. Janofski officiating. Burial was in the Decatur Cemetery. Memorials are to the Decatur Wesleyan Church and the donor's choice.

Mr. Landis, who retired as service manager at Kierkes Implements four years ago after 15 years of service, was an Adams County Farm Bureau employee for 14 years and also a farmer. He was a member of the Decatur Wesleyan Church.

Born in Adams County on June 9, 1915, he was a son of Earl and Bertha Fugate-Landis, and was married February 9, 1949, at Pleasant Dale Church of the Brethren to Virginia Hamrick. His father died April 18, 1968.

Survivors include the wife; the mother, of Decatur; a son, John E., route 6, Decatur; two sisters, Mrs. Russel Gene (Marie) Mitchell, route 2, Decatur, and Miss Ruth Landis, Richmond; six brothers, Harvey, route 4, Decatur; Arthur, Decatur; Herman, Columbia City; Willard, route 3, Decatur; Clifford, route 1, Monroe; Cleo, route 5, Columbia City; and two grandchildren, Jamie and Robbie.
