

DAVID A. LANGSTON

Funeral services will be held at 1 p.m. Saturday in Zwick-Sefton and Jahn Funeral Home for David A. Langston, 503 Stratton Way, who died Monday at the age of 67.

Rev. Elbert A. Smith will officiate. Burial will be in Decatur Cemetery, with military graveside rites by American Legion Post 43. Visting hours are 7-9 p.m. today and 2-5 and 6-8:30 p.m. p.m. Friday; a Masonic memorial service will be held at 8:30 p.m Friday.

Preferred memorials are to Shriners Hospitals for Crippled Children, First Presbyterian Church, or the Adams County chapter of the American Cancer Society.

Mr. Langston, who died in Adams County Memorial Hospital on his birthday, had been ill since February.

He was born on July 19, 1926 in Decatur to Charles C. and Marguerite Brown Langston and married Sanna F. Kunkel on January 17, 1948. She died on October 23, 1992. He retired in 1986 from Fort Wayne's Magnavox plant after a 25-year career as an engineer. He was a member of Decatur's First Presbyterian Church, having served as an elder, trustee and member of the men's quartet and the church choir. He also was a member of Masonic Lodge 571, Shriner's Club, Scottish Rite, American Radio Relay League, Adams County Amateur Radio Club, and the American Legion Post 43. He was the trustee of the repeater device based at Golden Meadows Home, assisted Civil Defense in communications and was in the Army Air Corps in World War II.

Surviving are three daughters, Mrs. David (Susan) Smith, Leavenworth, Kansas and Anne L. Smitley and Mrs. David (Joan) Eichhorn, both of Decatur; a son David C. Langston, Golden, Colorado; a sister, Mrs. Phillip (Alice) Trimble, Rochester, Minnesota; 12 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. One son, Mark K. Langston, died in infancy in 1954.
