### Ray Mosure Dies at 72; Rites Monday

Former Bluffton city councilman and businessman, Raymond W. Mosure, 72, of 57 Hi-Lo Dr., died of an apparent heart seizure believed to have occurred at 5 a.m. today.

His wife had noticed a light on in his room sometime during the night and upon arising at 8:30 a.m. found his lifeless body. His death came unexpectedly.

Formerly an assistant manager at the Isch Hardware Store, Mr. Mosure served one term as city councilman from 1952 to 1956 during the administration of Herschel H. Robins.

He retired in 1965 after operating Ray's Lunch at 116 West Washington St., for 12 years and also operated an adjoining rooming house for several years.

A member of the First United Methodist Church, he was a charter member of the Bluffton Lions Club.

Born April 11, 1903, in Vera Cruz, Mr. Mosure was a son of Edward and Edith Clark Mosure, who were killed several years ago in an auto-train crash at Craigville. His marriage to Mary M. Oliver who survives, took place March 2, 1929, in LaGrange.

In addition to the wife, he is survived by three daughters, Mrs. Ralph (Anita) Meade of Minocqua, Wis., Mrs. John (Barbara) Green of Lake Tomahawk, Wis., and Mrs. Constance J. Osborn of Bluffton; a brother, Forrest Mosure of Bluffton; a sister, Mrs. Gladys Lockwood of Fort Wayne; eight grandchildren; two great-grandchildren, four step-grandchildren and four step great-grandchildren.
