Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850,

Now know De, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said Hornas Hern,

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Thomas Hern, and to his

heirs and assigns forever.
