Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 27458 for *Eighty* acres, issued in favor of *Arthur V. Lawrence* *Minor Child of John Lawrence* deceased private in *Captain Mansfield's* Company *Third Regiment Ohio Volunteers*

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the *West half of the north West quarter of Section Eighteen in Township Twenty Six north of Range Fourteen East in the district of Lands subject to Sale at Indianapolis, Indiana containing Seventy nine acres and Seventy Six hundredths of an acre*

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said *Arthur V. Lawrence*

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Arthur V. Lawrence* and to his

heirs and assigns forever.
