WHEREAS Wade Loofbourrow, of Adams County, Indiana,

has deposited in the **GENERAL LAND OFFICE** of the United States, a Certificate of the REGISTER OF THE LAND OFFICE at Fort Wayne,

whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said

Wade Loofbourrow,

according to the provisions of

the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for

the North West quarter and the North East fraction of the South West quarter of Section thirty one, in Township twenty five North, of Range fifteen East, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Fort Wayne, Indiana, containing two hundred and thirteen acres and ninety hundredths of an acre,

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the **SURVEYOR GENERAL**, which said tract has been purchased by the said Wade Loofbourrow,

NOW KNOW YE, That the

United States of America, in consideration of the Premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, **HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED,** and by these presents **DO GIVE AND GRANT,** unto the said Wade Loofbourrow,

and to his heirs, the said tract above described: **TO HAVE AND TO HOLD** the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Wade Loofbourrow,

and to his heirs and assigns forever.
