To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

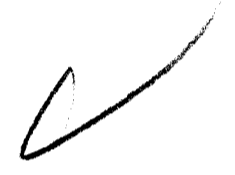
WHEREAS Abraham Moore, of Greene County Ohio

according to the provisions of

the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for

the East half of the South West quarter and the South West quarter of the South West quarter of Section ten, in Township twenty five South, of Range fourteen East, in the District of lands subject to sale at Fort Wayne, Indiana, containing one hundred and twenty acres



according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the **SURVEYOR GENERAL**, which said tract has been purchased by the said Abraham Moore

NOW KNOW YE, That the

United States of America, in consideration of the Premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, **HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED**, and by these presents **DO GIVE AND GRANT**, unto the said Abraham Moore

and to his heirs, the said tract above described: **TO HAVE AND TO HOLD** the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Abraham Moore and to his heirs and assigns forever.
