# The United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

**Whereas,** *Jonas Pence, of Champaign County, Ohio;*  
*has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Fort Wayne,*  
*whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Jonas Pence,*  
*according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for*  
*the North West fraction of <sup>the</sup> South West quarter of section twenty seven, in Township twenty eight North, of range*  
*fourteen East, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Fort Wayne, Indiana; containing sixty acres and <sup>thirteen</sup>*  
*two hundredths of an acre,*  
*according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-*  
*chased by the said Jonas Pence.*

**NOW KNOW YE,** That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,** in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and, by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said *Jonas Pence,*  
and to *his* heirs, the said tract above described: To  
Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said *Jonas Pence,*  
and to *his* heirs and assigns forever.

PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
