the West half of the North West quarter of Section Thirty, in Township Twenty Seven, North of Range fifteen East, in the District of Land, subject to sale at Fort Wayne, Indiana, containing eighty acres

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the **SURVEYOR GENERAL**, which said tract has been purchased by the said Robert H. Shea

and to his heirs, the said tract above described: **TO HAVE AND TO HOLD** the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Robert H. Shea

and to his heirs and assigns forever.
