

The United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

KNOW YE, That in pursuance of the third article of a Treaty made and concluded at St. Mary's, in the State of Ohio, between Jonathan Jennings, Lewis Cass and Benjamin Parke, Commissioners of the United States, and the Miami Nation of Indians, on the sixth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, THERE IS GRANTED by the UNITED STATES, unto the Children of Antoine Rivarre, two sections of land at the mouth of Twenty-seven Mile Creek and below the same, bounded and described as follows, to wit:

Beginning at a post on the bank of the River St. Mary's, from which a hickory ten inches in diameter bears north eighty-three degrees west, distant thirty-eight links, and a sycamore forty inches in diameter bears north thirty-six degrees west, distant forty-three links; thence north ninety-four chains to a post, from which a beech twenty-four inches in diameter bears south six degrees, thirty minutes east, distant eighteen links, and a beech seven inches in diameter bears south seventy degrees west, distant twenty-nine links; thence east one hundred ten chains to a post, from which a w. oak ten inches in diameter bears north fifty-five degrees east, distant twenty-two links, and a w. ash eleven inches in diameter bears south forty-five degrees, thirty minutes west, distant thirty-nine links; thence south one hundred fifty chains to a post, from which a buckeye fourteen inches in diameter bears south thirty-eight degrees west, distant eleven links, and a sugar tree eight inches in diameter bears north sixty-two degrees, thirty minutes west, distant thirty links; thence down the St. Mary's River, with the meanders thereof, to the place of beginning; containing one thousand two hundred eighty-five and sixty-three-hundredths acres;

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of land above described, with the appurtenances, unto the said Children of Antoine Rivarre, and

their heirs forever, as tenants in common and not as joint tenants, but never to be conveyed by them or their heirs, without the consent and permission of the President of the United States.

This patent is granted as and for a patent intended to have been granted and issued, as evidenced by its record found in Miscellaneous Volume of Patent Records, No. 465, page 235, but the issuance of which is not sufficiently proven by any obtainable evidence.
