Whereas, George Sanderson, of Fairfield County Ohio,
has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Fort Wayne,
whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said George Sanderson,
according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
the North West fractional quarter of Section seven, in Township twenty eight, North of Range fourteen,
East, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Fort Wayne, Indiana, containing One hundred and seventy
nine acres,
according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-
chased by the said George Sanderson.

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the
several acts of Congress, in such cases made and provided, have given and granted, and, by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said George Sanderson,

To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said
George Sanderson,
and to his heirs, the said tract above described:
and to his heirs and assigns forever.
