To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, Peter Study baker of Randolph County, Indiana,  
has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Fort Wayne  
whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Peter Study baker  
according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for  
the Fractional lot number two of Section seventeen, in Township twenty-five, North, of Range fourteen, East, in the District of  
Lands subject to sale at Fort Wayne Indiana, containing fifty acres and six hundredths of an acre,

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-  
chased by the said Peter Study baker

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the  
several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and, by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said Peter Study baker  
and to his heirs, the said tract above described:  
To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said  
Peter Study baker  
and to his heirs and assigns forever.
