To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 23th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 27,734 for 40 acres,

issued in favor of *Philip Wiggins, private, Captain Adams' Company, and sergeant in Captain Dewitt's Company, Ohio Militia, two services, Mar 1812,*

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the

*North West quarter of the South West quarter of section five, in Township twenty six North, of Range fourteen East, in the district of lands subject to sale at Indianapolis, Indiana, containing forty acres,*

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL;

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said

*Philip Wiggins,*

the tract of Land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Philip Wiggins, and to his*

heirs and assigns forever.
