KNOW YE, That in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled "An act to raise for a limited time an additional military force, and for other purposes," approved February 11th, 1847,

*Edward Bullin, late a Corporal in Captain Kennell's Com-
-pany of the First Regiment Ohio Volunteers -*

having deposited in the **GENERAL LAND OFFICE** a **WARRANT** in *his* - favor, numbered *3255*

THERE IS THEREFORE GRANTED BY THE UNITED STATES; unto *Willis C. Wilmore assignee*
of said Edward Bullin - the South West Quarter of Section
Thirty four in Township Twenty six North of Range Fifteen
East in the District of Lands subject to Sale at Fort Wayne
Indiana, containing one Hundred and Sixty Acres -

according to the official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the **GENERAL LAND OFFICE** by the **SURVEYOR GENERAL**, which said tract had been located in satisfaction of the above mentioned War- rant, in pursuance of the Act of Congress above mentioned, approved February 11th, 1847. **TO HAVE AND TO HOLD** the said *Quarter* - section of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Willis C. Wilmore, and to his* -

heirs and assigns forever.
