Fred J. Bollenbacher, 64, Kills Self; Funeral on Saturday

Fred J. Bollenbcher, aged 64, living near Chattanooga, O., committed suicide at 4

o'clock this morning by hanging himself in the hog house on his farm. His wife found the body, according to the report here. Mr. Bollenbacher had been in ill health for some time. He was well-known in Berne as he did much of his business here.
