Memorandum of an agreement
made between Mary Sexton of the County
of Adams and State of Indiana of the first
part and a Stephen S. Rugg of said County
of the second part Witnesseth that said
Mary has this day and by these presents
does sell, lease and remise to said Stephen
Sexton 91 in the Town of Decatur in
said County for the term of one year
from this date, for the sum of Eighteen
dollars, to be paid in the manner herein
after mentioned, And the ~~sa~~ appurtenances
buildings &c, to said Sexton belonging, and
the said Mary is to have the floor laid in
the south room of the house on said lot
within two weeks from this date and the
lot fenced in, by the first ^{day} of March

Of all of which the said Stephen is
to pay to her the said Mary the said
sum of Eighteen dollars in the following
manner to wit Nine dollars to be paid
in work and materials towards the finishing
of the unfinished room of said house
and nine dollars in Cash at the expira-
tion of the said term of one year from
this date
