Comes now the Clerk
of this Court and exhibits reports — the
presentation of — the account current and
vouchers in the book, in vacation,
to said Clerk for examination, and
upon such examination the same were
filed in said Clerk's office, which said
account current and vouchers are in
words and figures following to wit.
(Ex I) — and public notice having been
given by a publication in the Adams
County Democrat, a weekly newspaper
printed and published in said County,
that said account current would be
presented to the Court, at the August
term thereof for 1858, for examination
and settlement. which said notice
was published more than ten days
before the first day of the present term
of said Court. which said notice and
proof of publication has been duly filed in
the Clerk's office of said Court, which said
notice and proof of publication are in words
and figures following to wit; (Ex I) And the
Court after having carefully examined
said account current and vouchers and
notice and proof of publication, find that
said notice has been given according to law
and that said account current has been
verified by oath and appears to be substantially
correct, as evidenced by the vouchers. It is
therefore adjudged by the Court that the said
Administrator has completed his trust in
this behalf according to law. He is therefore
discharged from all further accountability to this
Court, and from all further liability on his
bond. And as there is a surplus for distribution of
the sum of one thousand and eighty six dollars
and thirty eight cents which sum is paid into
the Clerk's office of this Court into the hands of the Clerk thereof.

Whereupon the Court proceeded to make distribution of said surplus among said heirs and persons entitled, leaving first expenses under oath and touching the number of decedents heirs and the degree of relationship to him the said Jacob Pearce deceased. And the Court being fully satisfied from such examination that Mary A. Pearce is the widow of said Jacob Pearce deceased, and that Isaac Pearce and William Pearce are the children and the only children of the said Jacob Pearce deceased. And that they the said Isaac & Pearce and William Pearce are minors under the age of twenty one years. And it also appearing from Letters of Guardianship filed in the Clerk's Office of this Court that Charles Rigdon of Madison County and State of Ohio has been regularly appointed Guardian of Isaac & Pearce & William Pearce the said minor heirs of Jacob Pearce deceased or of said which said letters of Guardianship are in words and following to wit (to wit). And the Court being fully advised in the premises, find that the sum of one thousand and eighty six dollars and thirty eight cents remains in the hands of the Clerk of this Court for distribution among the widow & children of the said Jacob Pearce deceased. It is therefore ordered adjudged and determined by the Court that the Clerk of this Court pay to the said Mary A. Pearce widow as aforesaid the sum of three hundred and sixty two dollars and twelve cents two thirds of a cent for her share of said distribution of said surplus and that he pay to the said Isaac & Pearce and William Pearce the minor heirs of the said Jacob Pearce deceased the sum of seven hundred and twenty four dollars and twenty five cents and one third of a cent for their distribution share of said surplus. It is further ordered that the Clerk take Receipts from said Widow & Guardian of said minors for the said amounts of money thus ordered to be paid and that the said Receipts be filed in this office. All of which is ordered adjudged and determined by the Court.

Whereupon the said Clerk in open Court paid to the Mary A. Pearce widow as aforesaid the sum of three hundred and sixty two dollars & twelve cents and two thirds of a cent ~~being~~ the distribution share of said surplus which is now held in open Court.
