and desiring to make provision for my family
make public and solemnly hereby declaring to be
my last will and testament hereby making void
all other wills by me heretofore made.

Item First
It is my will that all my just debts and funeral
expenses shall be first paid out of my estate.
Item Second

After the payment of debts and funeral expenses
as in item first of this will provided there is no my
will and I hereby give and bequeath to my daughter
Barbara Schindler the sum of One Hundred (\$100)
the same to be here but shall not be paid to her
until after the death of my wife Lydia Schindler
Item Third

After the payment of debts and funeral expenses
and of the settlement of the special bequest
as mentioned in item second of this
will then it is my will and I hereby give
devise and bequeath to my beloved wife, Lydia
Schindler, all the net and residue of my estate as
remaining the same to be here absolutely and
in fee simple.
