RURAL ROUTES REORGANIZED

Neaderhouser and Sprunger Now Cover All of Berne Territory

The rural routes of Berne have been reorganized this week, and there are now only two routes out of Berne instead of three. Simeon Lehman, for 31 years a rural carrier out of Berne has been released on pension, leaving only Dan Sprunger and Louis Neaderhouser to cover the routes out of town.

Mr. Neaderhouser is now covering route 1, and Sprunger route 2. Many of the patrons who formerly were on route two are now on route one, and most of those who were on route 3 are now on route 2. Several who were formerly on Berne, route 3, now get their mail from Geneva.

Sprunger now covers all the Berne territory north and west of Berne. He goes as far east as the till mill road, north to the Monroe routes and the territory west of Berne.

Neaderhouser covers all the territory northeast, east and southeast of Berne.
