Mrs. Arveda Wagner, widow of the late Virgil Wagner of Montpelier, has accepted a position to teach in the Monroe high school during the coming year, it has been announced by Noah Rich, trustee of Monroe township who has just about completed arrangements for the Monroe township teaching faculty for the coming school year. It is understood that Mrs. Wagner will teach part time only, and will succeed Miss Dorothy Sprunger.

Another teacher who has not yet been definitely hired will also teach part time.
