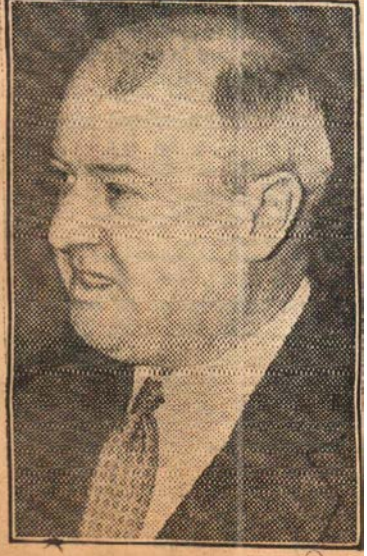

After Long Illness

Mrs. Emma Huser-Kirchhofer, 62, wife of Amos Kirchhofer, lifelong resident of Adams county, died at 9:20 o'clock Thursday night at her home in Wabash township. Mrs. Kirchhofer had been bedfast since March, and had been ill for many years. Death was due to dropsy and complications.

Mrs. Kirchhofer was born in Adams county, February 20, 1878, the daughter of Jacob and Lydia Lichty-Huser. She was married to Amos Kirchhofer on April 30, 1898.

Surviving besides the husband, are the following sons and daughters: Rufus Kirchhofer, rural route, Decatur; Mrs. Florence Lehman, Berne; Irene, at home; Wilbur, rural route, Geneva; the mother, Mrs. Jacob Huser of Blue Creek township, and the following brothers and sisters: Mrs. Katie Howell of Anderson; Albert Huser of Monroe township; Mrs. David D.
