Well-Known Man Dies from Indigestion; Was Tornado Victim in 1920

Perry O. Fields, 63, prominent farmer living nearly two miles south of Geneva, in Wabash Township, died suddenly at 2:30 o'clock Tuesday afternoon at his home. Death was caused by acute indigestion, it was reported. Mr. Fields, formerly owned the Fields Café at Geneva and was widely known throughout this part of Adams County.
