W. LINCOLN LONG, 84, BERNE NATIVE DIES
Funeral For Uncle of Archie Long At New Haven, Thursday P.M.

William Lincoln Long, 84, a native of this community and for many years a resident here, died Monday night at 9:00 o'clock at the Methodist hospital in Fort Wayne, where he had been a patient for the past three weeks. He was an uncle to Archie Long of this place, who was informed of the death yesterday morning.

The deceased had been a resident of New Haven the past 31 years and had been employed in Fort Wayne until he retired. He was a son of James Long, who with his family at one time lived on the farm now known as the David F. Lehman farm, and is remembered here among the older set.

Surviving are his widow, two sons and three daughters and 11 grandchildren. He was a brother to the late Sam and Malissa Long.

Funeral services will be held Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Harper & Son funeral home in New Haven. He was a member of the Evangelical church there.

CAROLINE DUBACH RITES THIS P.M.
Elderly Sister-In-Law of Local Man Dies Suddenly

Funeral services were held this afternoon at 2:00 o'clock at the Christian Apostolic church near Vera Cruz for Mrs. Caroline Dubach, 81, who died suddenly Monday morning at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Joel Kipfer at Craigville. House services were held at 1:00 o'clock and burial was in the church cemetery.

The deceased was the widow of John Dubach, and was a sister-in-law of Dave Dubach of this place.

Her lifeless body was found lying on the ground near the rear porch of the residence. After she had suffered the fatal seizure she had fallen from a stool on which she had been sitting while she had been engaged in cleaning rhubarb.

Dr. Asa W. Brown, Wells county coroner, was summoned and pronounced the cause of death.

Born in Ohio, Mrs. Dubach was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Fiechter. Her first marriage in August, 1879, was to John Heyerly, who died February 26, 1891. On March 8, 1896, she was married to John Dubach, whose death occurred Dec. 26, 1928.

Surviving are the daughter and three sons from the first marriage, Mrs. Kipfer, Jeff Heyerly of near Craigville, Albert and William Heyerly, both of near Decatur; a daughter and two sons from the second marriage, Mrs. Samuel Kaehr of near Decatur, Harry Dubach of Vera Cruz and Amos Dubach of near Bluffton; a brother, John Fiechter, of near Bluffton; 36 grandchildren and 25 great-grandchildren.
