To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas Ezekiel Retherford, of Martin County, Indiana, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vincennes whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Ezekiel Retherford according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 21th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the ~~Lot~~ <sup>Section</sup> ~~one~~ <sup>seven</sup> ~~of~~ <sup>of</sup> the ~~South~~ <sup>South</sup> fractional section seven, in Township one North, of Range five West, in the District of Indiana, as to sale at Vincennes, Indiana, containing twenty eight acres and twenty five hundredths of an acre according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Ezekiel Retherford.

**NOW KNOW YE,** That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,** in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Ezekiel Retherford and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said Ezekiel Retherford and to his heirs and assigns forever.
