# Simon/Price Key ancestry by John E Key

#### Overview

Our Key ancestry had hit a "Brick Wall." Researchers have been looking for the father of Simon Key and Price Key for a long time. A recent DNA match raises the possibility that our surname came from the John Key-Martin Key line but our Y-DNA came from the Ford line (one of the many variants of Foate).

## Background

A number of researchers have been exploring my line of Keys. Presently, my interaction has been mainly with Carlene Key Trouth and Frank Key and, to a lesser extent, Debbie Lowe. Carlene has studied the early records of the Keys and Kays from Virginia more than anyone I know. Frank has actively researched the Price Key line. Debbie has researched the Simon Key, Jr. line.

The elder of the Key group, which moved to Indiana in 1808 from the Scottsville, KY area, was Landon Key (1763-1821). A number of his siblings moved with him to Indiana: William, Simon, Jr. and Bennett. Landon's name is on a monument for Revolutionary Veterans located on the Court House Square, Gibson Co., Indiana.

William Key (1767-1855) was my 3g grandfather. Monroe Key (1841-1932), my g grandfather, and Nellie Key (1874-1961), one of his unmarried daughters, kept a ledger which outlined the descendants of William. Images from this ledger can be found at the following internet link:

The information in the ledger has been verified through the census records, deeds, Indiana marriage records and Indiana history books.

Simon Key, Jr. died in 1815 near Patoka, Indiana. This was about a year after the Black Plague wiped out about half of the population of Patoka. After the death of Simon Jr., Jesse, his son, and family moved to Mercer Co., Kentucky. Debbie is from this line.

Elijah Key left Kentucky after 1810 and moved to Gasconade Co., Missouri and then to Crawford Co., Missouri. They settled in an area which became known as Keyville. This family was mentioned in Julia Lane's book, "Key and Allied Families" and in the book "Crawford County, Missouri" by James Ira Brewer. Members of this branch have been keenly interested in family history. Carlene is a member of this line.

Elizabeth Key married Jeremiah Hinton and remained in the Allen Co., Kentucky area. There is a Hinton cemetery and a Hinton Creek in the area where they resided. Hinton, Guy, Walker and Snow are related surnames still living in the area south-west of Scottsville, Kentucky.

All of the early Keys above are children of Simon Key, Sr., who died in Warren Co., Kentucky in 1800. Four children (not all) were named in his will: Bennet, Luccacy, Simon Jr. and Obediah. The deed selling the family farm in 1809 was signed by his wife, Elizabeth, all of the living children (Landen, Simon Jr, William, Elijah, Bennett, Lucretia and Elizabeth Hinton). (Note: Allen Co. formed from Warren Co. in 1815). The earliest official record of Simon, Sr. was the Orange Co., Virginia order book (dated 20 May 1761) in which he was called as a

witness in the trial of John Key for the murder of John's wife, Mary Key. In 1767, Simon witnessed a real estate sale in neighboring Culpeper Co., Virginia. Simon was listed in the 1782 Orange Co., Virginia census. He remained in Orange Co. through 1789. By 1790 he was in the Bays Fork area of Kentucky, which ultimately became Allen Co., Kentucky.

Frank and I found each other through the results of a Family Tree DNA test, which we did in 2007. He is from the Price Key line. Initially, I was bit skeptical, but his paper trail is irrefutable. Revolutionary war records, census data and other official documentation are very clear. Further the Revolutionary War records confirm James Key was Prices brother.

There is considerable confusion about the parents of Price and Simon in the family trees published on the internet. Approximately half of the trees have Price and James attached to the Francis Key line, and the other half has them attached to the John Key-Martin Key line. I haven't found any documentation of proof for the placements. Further, there are at least two James Keys. Most have both James's death listed as occurring in 1817 in Mason Co., Kentucky, but the births are different: one was born in Maryland and the other in Virginia. The Revolutionary War records have two Jameses: one from Maryland and another from Virginia. Price is similar in that there are multiple Prices and much of the information is not correctly associated with our Price. Another source of confusion is Key, Kay and Kee, which are often interchanged in the Virginia and Kentucky records. This is understandable since many people could neither read nor write, and the recorder spelled the names phonetically.

# DNA leads

DNA testing has confirmed six matches for our Key line. Four have a paper trail to Simon Key and two have a paper trail to Price Key.

Of the 8,961 people who have tested at FamilyTreeDNA only 188 have been placed in the Key (and variations) DNA Project. The publically accessible link to the Key Project is:

Within the project, participants are grouped by similarity of DNA. Our group (Simon/Price) contains six entries. The most obvious conclusion from the Key Project is the Price/Simon group does not fit with the other Key/Key variant groups. Of particular interest is the Virginia Key USA group, which is the largest group with 54 members. This group includes Dr. Gene Key and Dr. Marcus M. Key, who are very active genealogists on the Virginia Key families. The Virginia group membership contains descendants of the John Key/Martin Key line. The most important observation is our DNA is significantly different from this Virginia group.

Table 1 is a summary of DNA matches for the six in the Price/Simon group, Tony Forte and three of the Key/Key variant groups. Ratios are presented for the 12, 25, 37 and 67 marker tests. The ratios are number of which matched me, John Key, to the number of markers tested. As you can see, Tony Fortes is clearly in our group. Of the 188 in the Key and variants, the Robert Keyes group is the nearest match, which is not very close of a match. The other Key groups have been even worse.

In the password protected part of FamilyTreeDNA, each subscriber has access to a list of matches which are ranked from strong to distant. My first five matches are in the Price/Simon group. The 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> entries are Antony and Jonathan Foate (they are 2<sup>nd</sup> cousins). It is interesting that Antony is a native of New Zealand. Anthony's parents and grandparents were born in Australia. Antony's earlier ancestors were from Kent Co., England. The question becomes:

# How do we get from Key to Ford?

I believe a partial answer is contained in the 227-page book, "The Keys of Colonial Virginia: Early Generations," by Marcus M. Key. A digital version of this book can be downloaded from the web site below:

The most relevant pages (41, 46 and 47) of the book to assist in the Ford/Key connection are attached in Appendix A.

Page 41 has a line starting with John Key, Sr. (b. 1600/20), continuing through John Key, Jr., to Martin Key and finally to orphaned sons, John (b. c1796) and Martin. Further, the chart shows the connection to the Tandy and Palmer families. Marcus did not list the wife of Martin, Jr. A number of researchers have his wife as Elizabeth Ford. What is known is that Martins' orphaned sons were placed under the guardianship of Wm. Ford. This is confirmed by the events recorded on page 46 where Wm Ford was listed as guardian in the 1706 court proceeding.

Page 46 lists a number of recorded events between 1690 and 1728 involving Fords in close proximity to the Keys. (Note: Several variants of the Ford name: Fore, Ford, ffoard, Foard, Foord).

# **Relevant Ancestor Trees**

Figure 1 presents a pedigree tree for the six who tested from our Price/Simon group. A second tree presents a portion of the Key tree as documented by Marcus M. Key, and, finally, Tony Forte's lineage. The paper trail to Simon and to Price is very well supported by public records. The connection of Simon to the John Key who murdered his wife is circumstantial because there is no mention in the public record of the relationship of Simon to John.

The descendants tree for John Key, Sr. (b. 1600-20) is based on Marcus Key's info (see Appendix A). Since families were usually large in that time period and it was not unusual for a person to marry multiple times, you can speculate that there are multiple family members are not shown. Additionally, many of the public records had been burned in the period of interest (1670-1750). This makes it difficult to the establishment of a paper trail for Simon or Price's early ancestors. Finding additional records to complete the descendants of John Key/Martin Key will be difficult because Marcus Key seems to have found what is available.

Anthony Foate's pedigree is based on information that he emailed and material he posted on Heritage.com.

There is not a direct link establishing a connection between the three ancestor trees. Research needs to continue on the Key/Ford connection during the late 1600s and early 1700s.

# Summary

A number of researchers have been working to document our Key ancestry over the years. Many have made assumptions and placed people in our family tree based on circumstantial events. Because of this, there are many errors in family trees published on the internet, in books, in collections in libraries, etc. Since DNA results have become accessible and affordable to the public, some of the tangled web has been untangled. The incorrect info seems to have a life of its own.

# Given that:

- 1) Our (six Keys in our testing group) paper trail ends with Simon Key or Price Key and our DNA (Price/Simon group) does not match any of the Key (and variants)
- 2) Anthony Foate's DNA is the closest non-Key match of all who have tested at FamilyTreeDNA
- 3) Marcus Key's findings listed several interactions with the Ford family (The strongest being the Wm. Ford guardianship of John Key III and Martin Key)

You must consider the speculation that our Y-DNA came from the Ford line and that our surname came from the John Key/Martin Key line.

There are other surnames with DNA reasonably close to our Key group (Edge, Bingham and Burgess), but their match is not as close to the match to Anthony, and we have not found any paper record linking these surnames to the Key surname in the timeframe of interest.


Hopefully, as the number of people doing DNA test results increases, we will get a better understanding of our ancestry.

## EXCURSUS: FORD

There were Ford families on both sides of the Mattaponi in early Colonial times, who were neighbors or near-neighbors of the Keys. Because of their having lived in "burned record" counties, little information on them is available. The references to Derby Collnon in the following suggest a connection between some of the Ford families. Note the variations in the spelling of Ford.

1690 John Fore's line mentioned in Martin Key's patent in Pamunkey Neck.<sup>1</sup>

1693 Ann Mallory appointed her father-in-law Capt. Roger Mallory of King and Queen Co, as her attorney to acknowledge her dower right in 500 acres of land in Pornonky Neck, which her husband William Mallory had sold to John Ford.<sup>2</sup>

1701 John Ford, his wife Margaret, and Derby Collnon were listed as headrights for John Thomson's patent in Pamunkey Neck.<sup>3</sup> It should be noted that several years, in some cases many years, elapsed between the transportation of the headrights and the granting of the patent.

1701 Derby Collnon was convicted and hanged for the murder of his Mistress Jane Ford in Stratton Major Parish, King and Queen Co. [across the river from Pamunkey Neck].<sup>4</sup>

1702 John ffoard, Senr., and Margaret ffoard his wife of King William Co. gave 300 acres of land and plantation belonging thereunto to their son William ffoard.<sup>5</sup>

1703 John <u>ffoard</u> of King William Co., Planter, gave 200 acres to David Powers, his son-in-law, and Jane his wife. Margaret, wife to John <u>ffoard</u>, acknowledged her dower right.<sup>6</sup>

1704 listings in the Quit Rent Roll of King William Co.: John Foord, Jr, (300 acs.), Wm Foord (800 acs.), David Powers (200 acs).<sup>7</sup>

1706 Wm. Noyes & Eliza his wife, Wm Holliday, John fford, John Greene & John & Martin Key Orphans by Wm. fford their Guardian, successfully opposed escheatment of their lands in the escheatment of 1500 acres from John Humes.<sup>8</sup>

1706, William Holderbee of King William Co., unsuccessfully petitioned for a supersedeas to stop a judgment in favor of Wm. Foard and Barbara his wife.<sup>9</sup>

1714 William Ford patented 85 acs., in St John's Parish, King William Co. on SW side of Mattapony, between Cole's Cr. and Great Cr.<sup>10</sup>

1728 William Ford petitioned the Governor to remit a fine which had been unduly assessed by the Court of King, William Co.<sup>11</sup>

The above Fords may have been related to Peter Ford, who patented 500 acs. known as "Catamount," on the northeast side of the Mattaponi near John Key's 1674 patent,<sup>12</sup> as well as other land in that area.<sup>13</sup> Peter Ford appears to have been imported by George Reade, who listed him as a headright in a 1648 patent for land on the south side of the Piankitank.<sup>14</sup> There was also a Henry Foard listed as a headright by Martin Palmer for his 1658 patent.<sup>15</sup>

Lastly, attention is called to two unusual name clusters--*Ford*, *Key*, and *Fartson* (also sp. Foson), but their significance, if any, has also eluded this researcher. One cluster occurred as headrights (Thomas Foson, Wm. Key, Wm. Foord, and Wm. Foard) for Devereux Browne's 1672\_patent in Northampton Co.<sup>16</sup> The other cluster consisted of landowners in New Kent (now King & Queen) Co. ca. 1670, Peter Ford, John Key, and *Mr*. Frederick Fartson were near-neighbors, as indicated by their patents.<sup>17</sup> Frederick Fartson and Susan Fartson had been brought over by Martin Palmer.<sup>18</sup> Williarn Keay was also a headright of Mr. Deveraux Brown, Accomac Co., 1671,<sup>19</sup> and William Key and Thomas Forsan were headrights of Capt.

Laurence Smith, New Kent Co., 1673.<sup>20</sup> The repeated appearance of a headright, such as William Key, suggests that he may have been a sailor on vessels coming to Virginia.

Appendix B

Discussion on Genetic Distance

There is a Youtube presentation by Maurice Gleeson which discusses using DNA to build a family tree. One of the slides in the presentation explains the relationship of genetic distance to how tightly the testers are related. I had been using the ratio (# matches / # markers tested). # Observations

- 1) Anthony Foate is the strongest non-Key match of all who tested at FamilytreeDNA.
- 2) The DNA data confirms that our y-DNA line is not from the Virginia Key group.
- 3) The known and available records for our family are from the same proximity as the Virginia Key group. (New Kent Co., Virginia)
- 4) There was considerable interaction between the Key and Ford families in early Virginia.

# Conjecture

The DNA results do indicate a high likelihood that our surname could be Foate/(Ford). There are other surnames must be considered: Burgess, Cook and Edge; but, there genetic distance is slightly greater and the timeframe for a common ancestor would be further back in history.
