Adam H. Finch, Pioneer of City, Called Beyond Aged citizen dies at home here after paralytic stroke.

BORN IN WAYNE COUNTY IN 1838

Operated store at Collett for Many Years after Leaving His Farm.

Adam Hamilton Finch, 84 years of age, died at his home on East Walnut Street Wednesday evening at 6:30 o'clock. Death was caused from paralysis.

The deceased was born in Wayne County, Indiana, September 7, 1838, the son of Thomas and Sarah Finch. He was one of the best known citizens of the south part of the county and was a farmer by occupation and for a number of years before coming to this city was postmaster at Collett, four miles south of this city.

Surviving are his (second) wife, Mary (Templer) Finch, three brothers, Isaac P. Finch, of Missouri, Calvin Finch, of Ottawa, Kansas; Willard Finch, of Rantoul, Kansas; one sister, Elizabeth, wife of William Farber, and the following children: Mrs. Lillie M. Jackson, Selma Finch, and Joseph R. Finch, of Portland.

Funeral services will be held Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the home. The Rev. H. N. Ronald will officiate. Interment will be made at Green Park Cemetery.
