Iris Freeman, 91, 4094 West Ind. 67, Portland, died Saturday in Adams Memorial Hospital.

Born in Jay County on Dec. 8, 1915, to Carl F. and Leota (McGeath) Baldwin, she was married on Dec. 14, 1933, to Orville L. Freeman, who died on July 21, 1998.

A recipient of the Cincinnatus Lifetime Achievement Award, memberships included Zion Lutheran Church, Women of the Church and Jay County Historical Society.

She had been a Den mother in Boy Scouts and a Girl Scout leader, where she was District 8 Chairwoman, a council board member, on the finance and nominating committees and a recipient of the Thanks Badge in 1978.

Survivors include four sons, Bill Freeman, Beaufort, S.C., Joe Freeman and Jack Freeman, both of Portland, and John Freeman, Bloomington; two daughters, Karen Redd, Marysville, Ohio, and Mrs. Mark (Susan) Fitzpatrick, Lebanon; 20 grandchildren and 35 great-grandchildren.

Services are Wednesday at 1 p.m. at Zion Lutheran Church in Portland with Pastor Mark Strietelmeier officiating. Burial will be in Green Park Cemetery.

Visitation is today from 4 to 8 p.m. at Baird-Freeman Funeral home and one hour prior to services at the church.
