

Quentin G. Imel, longtime printer and antique dealer, died Wednesday at Lutheran Hospital, Fort Wayne, after a brief illness. He was 63.

A resident of R R 1, Bryant, he was the owner and operator of Imel's Antiques there. Former supervisor of the commercial printing department of the Graphic Printing Co., Inc., he retired from the printing business in 1989.

Born in Ja County on Feb. 13, 1929, he was the son of Cecil and Dorothy (McCurdy) Imel Sr. He was a Korean War veteran of the US Army and had been awarded the Purple Heart.

On June 4, 1960, he was married to Sarah E. "Libby" Schubert, who survives.

A member of the Asbury United Methodist Church, Portland, he belonged to the Veterans of Foreign Wars, Geneva, the Moose Lodge of Portland, and the American Legion Post in Portland.

Surviving in addition to his wife are a son, Mike Teeters, Leesburg, Va.; four brothers, Cecil Imel, Robert Imel, and Larry Imel, all of Portland, and Jack Imel, Muncie; two grandchildren; two great-grandchildren; and several nieces and nephews.

Services will be at 1:30 pm Friday at the Baird-Freeman Funeral Home, with Pastor Gerald Hewson presiding. Burial will be in Green Park Cemetery.
