Portland, Indiana, January 7. --- John F. Leonhard, former Portland coal dealer, died at his home 10 miles northeast of this city Saturday afternoon at 4:15 o'clock. He suffered a heart attack and died suddenly while feeding some stock in the barn.

The deceased was born in Noble township June 5, 1865, the son of Frederick and Christena (Augustine) Leonhard. He was united in marriage September 17, 1890 to Carrie Prillaman, who died May 5, 1906. On November 25, 1909 he was married to May (Butcher) Baker, who survives. Mr. Leonhard was engaged in farming his entire life with the exception of five years in Portland where he was engaged in the coal business.

Surviving besides the widow are a son, Fred Leonhard, of Minneapolis; a daughter, Mrs. Frederick Montgomery, of Bryant; five sisters, Mrs. J. V. Ashcraft and Mrs. Tillie Snyder of Portland; Mrs. Frank Reasoner of Muncie, Mrs. Clara Denney of Ft. Recovery and Mrs. Guy Reuter of Winchester; a brother, Al Leonhard of Ft. Recovery, and three grandchildren. Two daughters, Fern and Irma; two brothers, William and George; two sisters, Mrs. Harvey Drake and Mrs. Ellston Adams, and a granddaughter, Margaret Ann, preceded him in death.

The body was removed to the Baird funeral home for burial preparations and taken to the late residence Sunday evening. Funeral services will be conducted Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock from the Westchester church, northeast of Portland, in charge of Rev. J. O. Lewis of Marion, assisted by Rev. E. E. Plumbly, pastor. Interment will be made in Green Park cemetery.
