

BURNIE POLING DIES AT HOME OF DAUGHTER

Burnie (Pop) Poling, 78, died suddenly this morning at 10:05 o'clock in the home of his daughter, Mrs. Sam Shoop, 109 South Race Street. He was stricken with a heart attack while sitting in his chair.

Mr. Poling was a native of Portland, Ind., born January 22, 1875. He had been making his home with his daughter for the past five years, and has been employed until Thanksgiving, at the Ridenour's Van Wert Poultry and Egg Market. Previously he had also been employed by the Ohio Poultry and Egg Market.

Besides the daughter, a son, Ezra Poling of New Castle, Ind., also survives. He is also survived by three brothers, Charles Poling of Fort Wayne, McKinley Poling of Portland and Brian Cox of Cincinnati; three sisters, Mrs. James Votam of Portland, Ind., Mrs. John Graves of Pontiac, Mich., and Mrs. Perry Hoad of Keego Harbor, Mich.; five grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

The body was taken to the Williamson Funeral Home at Portland and will be returned to the Shoop home Saturday, then Sunday to Portland where funeral services will probably be held Monday.
