

# SUDDEN WAS DEATH ATTACK

MRS. RHODA STARR VICTIM OF  
APOPLEXY EARLY THURSDAY  
AT COUNTRY HOME.

Miss Rhoda Rebecca Starr died very suddenly Thursday morning at eight o'clock at her late home one mile east of the Fair grounds. The deceased had been in her usual good health and Wednesday had spent the day with her sister, Mrs. Jacob Foltz, two miles east of town, assisting that lady in hanging wall paper. Thursday morning shortly after seven o'clock she went to the barn and after finishing milking and feeding the stock, hung the milk pail on the buggy, preparatory to returning to the house. Before getting out of the barn she fell to the floor, suffering an attack of apoplexy. She called for help and was carried to the house, where death ensued a half hour later. She leaves a mother, Mrs. Joseph Starr with whom she resided and the following brothers and sisters: John, Nimrod and Oren Starr, Mrs. Jacob Foltz and Miss Della Starr. The deceased was born September 28, 1870, and at the time of her death was aged 35 years, 5 months and 10 days.

The funeral services will take place Sunday morning at ten o'clock from the Providence Chapel east of the city, conducted by Rev. William Dillon. Interment in Green Park cemetery.
