

Gabor Joseph Takats, a Portland civic leader who was a member of the Indiana Football Hall of Fame and the Ball State University Athletic Hall of Fame, died early today at Persimmon Ridge Care Facility, Portland, following an extended illness. He was 90.

A resident of 503 W. Walnut St., Portland, he moved to Portland in 1951 and began working at what is now Porter-Takats Insurance Agency. He owned and operated the agency until his retirement in 1997.

An Indiana high school football referee for 24 years, he served on the board of the Jay County Boys Club for 30 years and was a member of the Portland Park Board for 30 years.

A Boy Scout leader for ten years, he was a longtime member of the Portland Rotary Club, the Portland Area Chamber of Commerce, the Portland Odd Fellows Lodge, the Portland Elks Lodge, Robert Guy Ayers American Legion Post 211, Jay Masonic Lodge No. 87, the Mizpah Temple Shrine of Fort Wayne, the Scottish Rite of Fort Wayne, and

was a past president of the Jay County Shriners Club.

A member of Asbury United Methodist Church in Portland, he served for 19 years on the board of the Peoples Bank.

He was elected to the Indiana Football Hall of Fame in 1977 and the Ball State Athletic Hall of Fame in 1985.
