

Daisy, eldest daughter of James and Amanda Wilkins was born in St. Mary's, Ohio on June 10, 1873 and died at the home of her father on West Main Street, at a few minutes before 12 o'clock Sunday night, February 28, 1897; aged 23 years, 8 months and 18 days. Daisy was well known in this city, having spent 15 years of her life here and her early death is sadly lamented by all.

On May 2, 1894, the same awful disease and foe of the race, consumption, which claimed Daisy as its victim, took away from the home the mother.

The funeral services were conducted by Rev. L. M. Krider at the M. E. Church on Tuesday at 1:30 pm and were largely attended. The interment was made at Green Park Cemetery.

Realizing that the end was at hand, the suffering girl made all the arrangements for her funeral and selected the following persons to bear her body to the grave: Misses Gertrude Gilpin, Dollie Chalfant, Lizzie Arthur and Lillie Arthur; Mesdames Dora Hardy and Mary House.
