

Joseph Landers, Redkey, Dies of Heart Attack

Redkey, Ind., Feb 13 – Joseph E. Landers, 68, retired employee of the Redkey Sawmill, died this morning at his home here of a heart attack.

An employee of the sawmill for more than a half century, he was born Oct. 1, 1881, the son of Martin and Mary (Steed) Landers at Ridgeville. He was married in 1902 to Miss Jennie Osborne.

Besides his widow, he is survived by three daughters, Mrs. Josie Abbott of Redkey, Mrs. Madonna Stafford of Anderson and Mrs. Mary M. Hamon of Redkey; three sons, Loren Landers of Troy, O., Cecil W. Landers of Redkey and Walter Dillmon of Dunkirk (adopted); one sister, Mrs. Rose Betts of Hilliard, Fla., and 11 grandchildren.

He was preceeded in death by one son, one brother and two half-brothers.

Funeral services will be conducted Wednesday afternoon at two o'clock from the Redkey Nazarene Church with the Rev. Loren Pendry of Monrovia, Ind., officiating, assisted by the Rev. Roger Ward, pastor.

Interment will follow in the Hill Crest Cemetery at Redkey.

The body will remain at the Williamson Funeral Home in Portland until the hour of the funeral.
