He painted houses indoors and outside and remodeled houses. While working and living in Redkey and Jay County, Ind., he was the Redkey Boy Scout Master, bringing four young boys to become Eagle Scouts, including his own two sons in 1965 and helping many others in ways no other could have. He became a member of the Boy Scouts Order of the Arrow and worked extensively with the Northeast Indiana LemberLost District and also the Gulf Stream Council of the Boy Scouts in Florida.

He was loved and will be sorely missed by family, friends and all who knew or met him, as he influenced many lives. With sweet sorrow we say, "'Til we meet again, with sweet memories, Your Loving Family."
