Portland, June 1 - Military funeral services for Clarence Dale Rook, 44, World War veteran, will be conducted Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock from the Redkey United Brethren Church in charge of Rev. J. H. Nall, pastor of the Portland United Brethren Church. Interment will be in the Redkey Cemetery.

Mr. Rook was found dead in the sheep house on his farm one-half mile north of Ridgeville about 9:30 o'clock Friday night. He enlisted in the Navy in May, 1913, and served until August 14, 1919.

Surviving are the widow, Ethel; four children: Gaynall Darwin, Marvin Gale, Clarence, Jr., and Herman Duane, all at home; the parents, Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Rook of northwest of Portland; one brother and three sisters, Frances Rook and Mrs. Jesse Kinley of Redkey, Mrs. Elsa Stakebake of Portland and Mrs. Herman Ploetner of Detroit.
