HAD PEANUT IN THROAT

PORTLAND, Ind. Sept. 27 - An autopsy conducted over the remains of the two-vearold son of Mr. and Mrs. Russell Graef, southeast of the city, who choked to death Monday noon, revealed a peanut lying across the trachea just below the vocal cords. The baby had been eating peanuts Sunday morning and almost strangled to death when one lodged in his throat. He rallied and was apparently all right, being able to play about the house. Monday noon he suffered another choking attack, dving within a few minutes.
