

Services for Herman “Cap” Klingel, 89, RR 6, Portland are set for 2 pm Sunday in the Portland Chapel of the Williamson and Spencer Funeral Home with Pastor Timothy Dutcher-Walls officiating. Burial will be in the Salamonina Cemetery.

Klingel died Friday morning at the Methodist Hospital, Indianapolis, following a brief illness.

He was a retired Madison Township dairy farmer and was a breeder of Ayrshire cattle. Klingel was well-known as a local, state and national judge of Ayshires. He was a member of the Ayrshire Breeders Association. Klingel was a member of St. James Lutheran Church of Salamonina.
