

John J. Stultz, 63, Montpelier, a long-time resident of Pennville died Wednesday evening at Caylor-Nickel Clinic, Bluffton.

Stultz formerly worked at the Trenton District of the Indiana State Highway Department and was retired from Blackford County Schools.

A lifetime resident of the Pennville and Montpelier area, he was a graduate of Pennville High School and served in the Korean War. He was a member of the Pennville American Legion, was the master of the Pennville Grange and was a member of the Hickory Grove Church of the Brethren.
