Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 50,188, for 40 acres, issued in favor of *Javen Ball, private, Captain Colton's Company, North Carolina Militia, Mar 1812,*

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the

North West quarter of the South West quarter of Section nine, in Township twenty four North, of Range thirteen East, in the district of Lands subject to sale at Indianapolis, Indiana, containing forty acres,

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL:

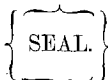
Now know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said
