(No objection to his being reenlisted is known to exist.\*) Said Samuel E. Hall, was born in Jay County in the State of Indiana is Twenty Three years of age, six feet one inches high. Light complexion, grey eyes, light hair and by occupation when enrolled a farmer. Given at Baton Rouge, La, this Tenth Day of October 1865.
