

Marshall County Historical Museum Bible Inventory

The following Bibles are in the museum collection, stored in archival boxes in the Library Storage Room (Heavy Archival)

The Family # refers to photocopies made of family information found in the Bibles and placed in a notebook titled "Misc. Family Records from Bibles".

This notebook is on the shelves labeled "Marshall County Families". Those with no number given contained no personal information. The Ringgenberg, Wingert, and another given #35 are all written in old German and could use a good translation.

Family #36 in the Misc. Family Records notebook, contains photocopies made from the William T. Leonard Bible. After the family pages and photographs were copied, the Bible returned home with the owner. This same procedure will apply to future records added to the notebook of family Bible records.

| | Undated clipping found in the Bible: "THOMAS AUSTIN was born August 2d, 1771, in the state of Maryland. He came to Ohio in the autumn of 1809, and settled on Todd's Fork, Clinton County, where he resided until his death, which occurred May 30th, 1844. He was emphatically a man of peace. Probity, integrity, and candor, characterized all his intercourse with society. Hence, he was respected and beloved by all who knew him. As a Christian, he was uniform and consistent, but modest and unpretending. Under his roof the weary messenger of peace ever found a kind reception and quiet home. Although his Christian Course was marked with reserve, and even timidity, yet in his last illness he was confident and triumphant. He has left an aged and pious widow and several children, all exemplary members of the Methodist Episcopal Church, in the communion of which he had lived for many years, and from its pale entered his eternal rest in the seventy-third year of his age. In accordance with his request the occasion of his funeral was improved by some reflections on 2 Cor. V, 1-4. His remains were deposited in his own family burying ground. | | |

In Memoriam, (clipping dated 1 Aug. 1930) Sarah Blain-Woodrow, daughter of Gideon and Sarah Bryant-Blain was born May 22, 1848 in Adrian, Michigan and died in Plymouth, Indiana on July 30, 1930. Before coming to Michigan, Mr. and Mrs. Blain had lived in Ovid, New York. Sarah was the youngest of seven children. Of these, three died in an epidemic of scarlet fever in Adrian. In the late '50's the father and mother with the four remaining children came to Plymouth. Few are left who remember them, identified as they all were with the life of the growing city. Gideon Blain was indeed one of Plymouth's pioneer merchants. He established the double store for drugs and groceries on what was long known, and even yet is sometimes alluded to as "the Blain Comer".
