Morocco Man Killed In Accident

INDIANAPOLIS — A 42-year-old Morocco man died during surgery at Wishard Memorial Hospital May 9 as a result of multiple injuries suffered when high winds toppled a dump truck.

Daniel Hayworth, a driver for Great Lakes Bulk Service Inc. of Remington, died about 12:30 p.m. at Wishard following the accident at approximately 9 a.m. The accident occurred at a construction site in the downtown area at Capitol and Washington streets a few blocks from Union Station near the statehouse, officials say.

Stephen Dupue, president of Great Lakes Bulk Service, said Tuesday morning that initial indications of the ongoing investigation by local and state authorities showed 25-38 mph winds present in the downtown area at the time of the accident were contributing factors.

The Indiana office of the Occupational and Safety Health Administration (I-OSHA) is one of the agencies investigating the incident. Hayworth was apparently unloading dirt when the truck overturned, authorities say.

Pam Boyd, Deputy Commissioner for Planning and Administration of I-OSHA, said Tuesday morning that

investigators of the agency were on the scene within an hour following the accident.

"We were aware of what happened and we had someone on the scene immediately," Boyd said. "We are investigating the accident, but we do not have a full report yet."

Boyd said I-OSHA is involved in the investigation for the side that it was a construction accident.

Danny Hayworth was well known

in the Morocco Area. Residents were deeply stunned.

Comments heard concerning his life centered on his love for his family and children. One very seldom saw Danny in town without one or all of his children with him. His smiling face and familiar wave to all will be remembered.

Newton County and Morocco in particular suffered a great loss with the passing this man.
