

Ivan T. Hafstrom

Ivan T. Hafstrom, 72, of Sacramento, Calif., died Thursday, April 6, 1989 while a patient in a Sacramento hospital.

Born in Morocco, he was the oldest son of John and Hazel Hafstrom. He was a 1934 graduate of Morocco High School and served in the Army Air Corps as a photographer for the Pentagon in Washington D.C. and a navigator in the European and Pacific theaters during World War II.

Following his retirement as an Air Force master navigator in 1963 from McClellan Air Force Base, he worked briefly for the old Pope Photography Studio in downtown Sacramento before joining state service as a photographer. He worked with the Department of Water Resources and later with the CHP. He retired in 1977.

After his retirement, he was a photojournalist and a photography adviser for the Writing for Publication program at American River College for the past 12 years. He was also a long time photography volunteer for the state Department of Parks and Recreation, and many of his works have been published in

official state publications.

Hofstrom was given the title of Associate of the Royal Photographic Society of Great Britain in the 1950s and was a member of the California Writers Club.

He returned to Morocco to help his graduating class celebrate their 50th anniversary in 1984 after which he visited Sweden and traced his family history while visiting there with relatives.

Survivors include his wife of 44 years, Dorothy Padon Hafstrom; two sons, Ivan D. of Reno, Nev. and Jon D. of Eureka, Calif.; two daughters, Carola Hafstrom McMurray of Grass Valley, Calif. and Marsha Lynne Hafstrom of Roseville, Calif. and three grandchildren. He was preceded in death by a brother, Jack of Morocco and a sister, Jean Munson of Kankakee.

Survivors in the Morocco area include first cousins, Elmore and Verle Bartholomew and the decendants of Levie Smart. He also has a cousin, Arthur Hafstrom at Watseka.
