Notes for Jonathan Edward GARRISON

Jonathan sold land he owned in Allen County, Kentucky to his nephew, Hezekiah Alexander ¹⁵ Garrison.

ON 18 Nov. 1816, Jonathan and Anna (his wife) sold to John M. Garrison for \$200, a parcel of land (acreage not stated) in the Allen County, Kentucky, on the west fork of Bays Fork. (Jonathan signed his name. Anna made her mark.)¹⁶

In 1820, he was in Sullivan County, Indiana. (census page 115)

After marriage, he moved to Parke County, Indiana, prior to 1820. He received a land patent there on 10 Mar 1824, and another on 26 Sep 1831.¹⁷

Jonathan was an elder of the Shiloh Presbyterian Church in Parke County, Indiana. In 1822, a young missionary, Charles Beatty, gathered up the few Presbyterian families living along Little Raccoon Creek between the mouth of that stream and the present site of Waveland. After preaching for some weeks, he organized a society known as the Shiloh Presbyterian Church, and in 1824, they built a hewed log house near Little Raccoon Creek, about four miles northeast of Rockville. This was evidently the first church house in Parke County, but its exact location cannot be identified. Jonathan Garrison was one of the elders of this church. Later his church became Rockville Memorial Church.¹⁸

He is listed as the head of household in the 1830 Census of Parke County, Indiana, on page 113, line 20.

Moved to Township 6N4E, Fulton Co., Illinois, by 1840 Census.

In 1850, he was living with his son, Jonathan Edward, Jr.'s family in Carthage, Hancock County, Illinois. He was 70 years old, born in North Carolina, a farmer. In the household with him were his son Jonathan E., age 39, born in Tennessee, Nancy C. age 15, born in Illinois, and Calvin M., age 10, born in Illinois, children of his son, Jonathan, Jr.¹¹

Notes for Mark Alexander (Child 1)

Mark is listed as head of household in the 1840 Census of Parke County, Indiana, on page 159, line 23.

Records of Gordon Davis show that his family moved to western Missouri around 1839/40. Look in Nevada, Missouri for them. He married into a family which was active in missionary work to the Indians.

In 1850, Mark and family were enumerated in Neosho, Newton County, Missouri. He was 48 years old, born in Kentucky, and shown as a carpenter and joiner. His real estate was valued at \$400. With him were Frances, age 35, William, age 16, Caroline, age 14, Eliza, age 12, James, age 9, Alexander, age 7, and Jonathan, age 5. Also in the house was William T, age 18, a carpenter, [The latter would be a nephew, William Tennant Garrison, eldest son of his brother, Jonathan]⁸

In 1860, Mark and his family were enumerated in Center Township, Dade County, Missouri, Post Office: Greenfield. He was a farmer, with real property valued at \$1200 and personal property valued at \$800. He was 58 years old, born in Kentucky. With him were Francis M. Garrison, age 42, born in Tennessee; Caroline J. Garrison, age 24, born in Indiana; Eliza A Garrison, age 22, born in Indiana; Thomas A. Garrison, age 18, born in Indiana; Jonathan P. Garrison, age 14, born in Missouri; Benjamin R. Garrison, age 10, born in Missouri; Mary J. Garrison, age 7, born in Missouri; and Margaret M. Garrison, age 5, born in Missouri.⁷

In the next house was William Garrison, age 28 a carpenter born in Indiana, Harriet V. Garrison, age 22, born in Tennessee, and Eliza J. Garrison, age 10 Months, born in Missouri⁷

Samuel is listed as the head of household in the 1930 Census of Parke County, Indiana, page 120, line 5.

In a letter written 22 May 1852, her father called her Esther. ¹⁹	
Notes for Jonathan Edward (Child 5)	
At the time of the 1850 Census, he, Mary Ann, Nancy Ellen, and Cal, were living in Carthage, Hancock County, Illinois, and his father, Jonathan Edward, Sr., was living with them and listed as head of the household. The entries were as follows: Garrison, Jonathan E, age 70, male, farmer, born in NC, Garrison, Mary A., age 42, female, born in OH Garrison, Jonathan E., age 39, male, born in TN. There is something entered on this line, in the final column about disabilities, which is too faint to read in the digital images. Garrison, Nancy E., age 15, female, born in IL Garrison, Calvin M. age 10, male, born in IL ¹¹	
On 22 May 1852, he addressed a letter to James R. Garrison in Rossville, Ohio, from Newton County, Missouri. ¹⁹ This would be to his son, James Rankin Garrison.	
Notes for James Rankin (Child 6)	
In 1853, James and Susan were living in Rossville, Ohio. ¹⁹	
In 1885, James was enumerated in the Kansas State Census in Rock Creek, Coffey County, Kansas. He was 75 years old and married. born in Kentucky. It states that he had moved to Kansas from Illinois. With him in the household were: S. J. Garrison, age 54, female, married, born in Ohio; J. E. Garrison, age 29, male, single, a farmer, born in Ohio. H.N.Z. Garrison, age 21, male, single, born in Ohio; G. N. G. Garrison, age 18, female, single, born in Illinois; A. M. Garrison, age 23, male, married, born in Ohio, farmer; H. F Garrison, age 22, female, married, born in Illinois. ²⁰	
[my deductions from the above: S. J. Garrison is Susan, James' second wife. J. E. Garrison was born about 1856 and was a son of James and Susan. H.N.Z. Garrison, was born about 1864, and was a son of James and Susan G.N.G. Garrison was born about 1867, and was a daughter of James and Susan A. M. Garrison was born about 1862, and was a son of James and Susan H. F. Garrison was born about 1863 and was the wife of A. M. Garrison A. M. Garrison and H. F. Garrison were probably married in Illinois before the family moved to Kansas]

Military Induction apr. 1862, as a Private in Co. G, 7th Regiment, Missouri State Militia, Cavalry. Discharged Nov. 1863. ¹	
Immediately after his marriage to Margaret, they relocated to Carthage, Hamilton Co. [Hancock Co.?] Illinois, settling on a farm. ¹
