GEORGE G. CLINE

George G. Cline was born in Richland county, Ohio, Sept. 4, 1824, and died last Wednesday morning, July 31, 1907, at five o'clock surrounded by his loved ones at his home on the east shore of Fox lake as the result of a stroke of paralysis sustained a few days before, at the ripe old age of 82 years, 10 months and 27 days.

In 1854 he came with his parents, Wm. And Ellen Cline, to LaGrange county, Ind. He was one of a family of nine children, of whom three survive, two sisters and one brother, all of LaGrange county. On Oct. 15, 1854, he was married to Martha Ann Case, daughter of James and Laura Case, of Steuben county, and settled in Pleasant township. For half a century they shred together life's toils and labors, its mingled joys and sorrows. She died Sept. 22, 1903. To this union five sons were born all of whom survive: Albert, George, Hubbard, James and William. He also had thirteen grandchildren and three great grandchildren. Mr. Cline in his early days was a carpenter but finally devoted his time and energy to farming. He was a man of business integrity, economy and industry. He was a faithful and devoted husband, a kind father and a considerate neighbor. He was a man of few words and quiet and meditative.

The funeral services were held at his late residence Friday, Aug. 2, 1907, Rev. Barton B. Bigler, minister of First Presbyterian church of Logansport, officiating. Burial in Old cemetery north of Angola.
