Willard KIDDER, for Many Years Prominent In City's Business Circles, Dies Willard Kidder, one of the oldest residents of the city and for many years active in local business circles, died Tuesday afternoon at the residence, 456 North Center Street. Mr. Kidder had been ill for several weeks and his death at this time was not unexpected by the family and friends. He was 93 years old and had lived in Terre Haute for more than fifty years.

Logan, 80 years old, and for many years an instructor at Rose Polytechnic Institute, from which he retired some time ago, died at the residence, 1501 North Center Street, early Sunday morning, following an illness
